Case Study:

Ysgol Glanrafon, Mold







Wynne Construction was appointed by Flintshire County Council to design and build a new six classroom extension and remodeling of the existing Ysgol Glanrafon in Mold to include additional car parking and external works. The extension of the site will allow the school's capacity to increase and was funded through a Welsh **Government Welsh Medium Capital grant.**

The project started in November 2020 and the workforce and supply chain overcame the challenges presented by the COVID-19

pandemic, to continue working in a safe environment with consideration for the wellbeing of all site employees.

During the design phase, we held workshops with the pupils to gain their ideas for how the remodeling of the school should look.

We continued to deliver social value through online and virtual activities, including a Q&A session with project architect, virtual mock interviews with pupils from Hawarden High School and employer engagement sessions with Coleg Cambria learners.

Support for healthy, resilient and cohesive communities

During this project we contributed £4,728 to community initiatives including a donation to Ysgol Maes Garmon towards funding of essential books and novels for the English Department. We donated equipment to the 'Tidy Mold Day' organised by Mold Town Council and 3 members of our site team volunteered 2 hours in the Mold Spring Clean campaign around the town.

We also donated the wood that was used for the easy-edge system on the roof (in place of scaffolding) towards our Flintshire County Council, Early Years scheme to make the wooden planters for each school site.

The project safeguarded 370 construction jobs, with 17% residing within Flintshire and 42% living within 30 miles of the site. Carbon emissions from road transport and travel were therefore kept to a minimum.

Key Performance Statistics for the project

- **55%** project spend with Welsh-based SMEs **21%** within Flintshire/Mersey Dee region.
- 11 apprentices employed on the project 8 apprentices residing within 30 miles of site.
- 3 paid work experience placements achieved in electrical works.
- £4,728 raised/donated towards charity and community initiatives.
- 172 pupil engagements achieved via virtual and online workshops and presentations.

Enhancing skills, employment and other area priorities

Local Supply Chain: Our commitment to the local economy and supply chain, achieved 55% project spend with Welsh-based SMEs (21% of this spend within Flintshire/Mersey Dee region), significantly supporting the region.

Work Placement Opportunities: We delivered 3 work experience placements for a total of 17 weeks. Our electrical contractor offered 3 learners from Coleg Cambria paid work experience during the summer holidays. The learners also gained their CSCS card through the CITB Onsite Experience Hub. One of the learners successfully gained an apprenticeship with the subcontractor.

The Ysgol Glanrafon project employed **11** apprentices and achieved **236** apprenticeship training weeks for the scheme. Four of the apprentices resided in Flintshire, with the remaining based in North Wales/North West England. Our focus on sustainable employment, achieved 1 new entrant working on the project.

In addition, both direct employees and supply chain partners completed short courses, qualifications and technical/higher level qualifications and the overall result of **141 training weeks/£m spend**, meeting and exceeding the NWCP Framework target of 78 weeks/£m spend.

Sustainable legacy

During the construction phase, 95% of the waste created was diverted from landfill (a total of 135.28T) meeting Welsh Government targets. The wood donated to the Early Years project that had been used for the easy-edge system on the roof also resulted in a reduction of recycling the wood utilised on site and created **savings of £3,500.**
