Y Prosiect The Project

TG Williams Builders Ltd was appointed by Wrexham County Borough Council to deliver a new single-storey After School Facility within the grounds of Ysgol Alexandra, Wrexham. The scheme provides a modern, purpose-built space designed to support wrap-around childcare provision for the school community.

The building is constructed on a raft foundation with facing-brick cavity walls, concrete tiled roofing, and high-performance aluminium windows and doors. The structure incorporates cavity insulation, damp-proofing, and a full internal fit-out including plasterboard partitions, joinery, ceramic tiling, safety flooring, kitchen units, sanitaryware, decoration, and all associated fixtures and fittings.

Internally, the facility offers a bright and robust environment suitable for childcare use, complete with a kitchen/ servery, WC provision (including accessible facilities), storage areas, and a flexible main activity room. Mechanical and electrical services include ventilation, plumbing and drainage installations, electrical fixtures, and heating systems compliant with the project specification.

External works include the formation of a fenced play area, new drainage installations, kerbs and edgings, surfacing, soft landscaping, and all associated groundworks. Works were carried out within a live school environment, requiring strict control of access, safeguarding measures, and close coordination to minimise disruption to staff, pupils, and visitors.

This project demonstrates TG Williams Builders Ltd's continued commitment to delivering high-quality educational and community buildings, providing long-term value, safety, and functionality for the families of Ysgol Alexandra.
